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The Practice: How to Stay Visible

7 Practical Ways to Stay Visible, Relevant, and Human

1. **Write to Be Answered**
End posts with a genuine question—not a statement.
2. **Design for Conversation**
Use: insight → short story → lesson → one question.
3. **Keep Links Out of the Main Post**
Tell the story first. Place links in comments if needed.
4. **Engage Like a Host**
Respond to comments with curiosity, not closure.
5. **Be Active Before You Post**
Engagement creates momentum. Visibility is reciprocal.
6. **Use Short Native Video**
One idea. One minute. Presence over polish.
7. **Speak as a Person, Not a Position**
The algorithm favors authenticity over authority.

You're not building an audience. You're hosting a room.

The Application & Invitation

Visibility Is Not the Goal—Connection Is

The algorithm rewards what people respond to.

And people respond to:

- Being seen
- Being invited
- Being understood

For leaders, consultants, and speakers, this matters deeply.

Your content should quietly answer one question:

“Do I feel safe engaging with this person?”

When the answer is yes, visibility follows.

A Simple Next Step

You don't need to overhaul your LinkedIn presence.

Start with:

- One post this week designed to invite conversation
- One thoughtful response to every comment

- One follow-up message rooted in appreciation, not pitch
